MINISTRY STORY

In the midst of crisis, the community of faith has come together to respond over and over again throughout history. The crisis that has come about in Myanmar (Burma) since the military took control of the government in early 2021 has seen people of faith all over the world step in to help. Among the Karen, churches in the hills throughout Northern Thailand have loaded up pick-up trucks with rice, salt, dried soup, clothing, blankets, mosquito nets, and much more which their members have donated, and they have driven the three to ten hours to the border to distribute to those in need on the Myanmar side of the border. Once delivered to the other side, which sometimes is very difficult, a network of pastors and church leaders have been distributing the goods to those in need. In many areas in the Karen and Kayah States, local Christians have taken in those who have fled persecution, so that they have a place to live. It is a time of great tribulation in the lives of many in Myanmar and the local believers have

been responding with an outpouring of compassion and care. When we see what local people like the Karen in Thailand and Myanmar are doing to help others, let us be encouraged to join the family of faith to respond with our resources, even when it may seem limited. Together we can make a difference in people's lives.
