When visiting schools and meeting with teachers, directors and school boards, I have heard many testimonies of God's faithfulness and of the many pressing needs. One school in Masatepe, Nicaragua, faces numerous challenges, yet has a strong dedication to the students. It is also home to a Talita Cumi Girls' Club (TCGC).

During my visit, I had a chance to engage with both the schoolteachers and the local TCGC leaders. Their dedication to the girls and the teachers' excitement toward the club is encouraging. I was also encouraged by the school's overall dedication to all children who attend. In sharing about the literacy training seminar I am developing, the director and teachers expressed keen interest in having me give the seminar to all their teachers!

The director shared that many teachers lack formal training in education and that this seminar would be an empowering and enriching training.

The school faces numerous infrastructure challenges, including the need for renovated bathrooms, an updated and safer preschool play area, classroom furniture and teaching materials. While their needs are indeed substantial, what struck me the most was their unwavering commitment to educating the students and to their community. Their dedication and passion left a lasting impression on me. And I am excited to go back!
