MINISTRY STORY

The Darien Gap is the midpoint of the journey for many of the migrants traveling from South America heading north. It is a remote jungle between Colombia and Panama, which most migrants say is the hardest part of the journey. There is no food or water, or any sign of civilization, and it can take several weeks to cross. There is no way around it. Once they are through the jungle, migrants come to a small village and catch a ride on a boat upriver to a United Nations camp, where they can find food and rest.

I recently spent some time in the camp and welcomed the travelers as they arrived. At the river, I noticed Louise, a young Haitian woman who came to check each boat, one after another. She cried as she could not find her sister, Camille, among any of the new arrivals. Camille had become separated somewhere in the jungle three days before, and Louise was desperately trying to find her. I waited with her for the last six or seven boats of the day, but Camille never came. Louise had lost her only family, and she had no

idea how to go on, or why. Her grief was unbearable.

As I accompany people along the impossible roads they must travel, I will forever be haunted by the image of Louise on the banks of that river. I am reminded that these asylum seekers have already had losses greater than I could imagine.
